Highwater Farm was born out of a community vision to increase the availability of fresh produce in our region and provide meaningful job opportunities for local teens.



IN GARFIELD COUNTY, WHERE WE ARE LOCATED, 27% OF FAMILIES HAVE REPORTED FOOD INSECURITY.*

We are working to address the intersecting challenges our society faces by cultivating a resilient local ecosystem and an empowered community that knows where their food comes from.

Since breaking ground in 2020 we have increased production each year – from growing 8,000 lbs of fresh vegetables in our first season to 35,000 in our third.

HIGHWATER HAS A 25-YEAR LEASE OF 3 ACRES ON THE SILT RIVER PRESERVE,

on land that was previously slated for development and bears the impact of herbicide applications and earth moving.

Our stewardship practices restore health and diversity to the soil and encourage a robust and thriving ecosystem.

In 2023 we are continuing to scale up our production, expand our youth programming, and strengthen our infrastructure in order to sustain long term growth — allowing more members of our community to access nutrient-dense local produce.
